**URGENT REITERATION OF STRICT SCHOOL SECURITY PROTOCOLS AND
THE IMPLEMENTATION OF DEPED ORDER NO. 006, S. 2026 (GUIDELINES ON
ENSURING A SAFE AND MOTIVATING LEARNER ENVIRONMENT)**

To: Asst. Schools Division Superintendent
Chiefs, CID and SGOD
Education Program Supervisors
Public and Private Elementary and Secondary Schools Heads
All Other Concerned

1. In light of recent grave security threats—specifically the alarming stabbing and shooting incidents reported within and near school premises nationwide—this Office heavily emphasizes that the safety, security, and well-being of our learners, teachers, and school personnel remain our absolute and non-negotiable priority.

2. Driven by these critical security emergencies and the urgent need to maintain optimal vigilance, all public and private elementary and secondary school heads are hereby directed to immediately adopt and execute stricter security measures, including but not limited to:

- a. Intensified gate control and strictly enforce logbook sign-in, mandatory presentation of valid IDs for all visitors, and comprehensive baggage/bag inspections at school entrances;
- b. Heightened visible security by maximizing the deployment of school guards, watchmen, and designated *barangay tanods* or PNP partners during peak arrival and dismissal periods (Please see enclosure for the Roster of designated *Pulis sa Barangay*, courtesy of the Iriga City Police Station);
- c. Conduct thorough sweeps of school grounds to clear potential entry points or hidden hazards and ensure all functional security cameras (CCTV) are active and monitored; and
- d. Update and practice multi-hazard contingency plans, ensuring learners and staff know exactly how to respond to active threats or emergency lockdowns.

3. To anchor these emergency responses in systematic learner protection, this Memorandum explicitly attaches and incorporates Regional Memorandum No.

4. As detailed in the attached enclosure, DepEd Order No. 006, s. 2026 consolidates and harmonizes all existing issuances concerning Learner Rights and Protection (LRP). It explicitly mandates clear security protocols, incident reporting mechanisms, and vital mental health and psychosocial support systems to combat bullying, violence, and other harmful practices.

5. Pursuant to this integration, all School Heads are ordered to:

- i. Disseminate the contents of DepEd Order No. 006, s. 2026 immediately to teachers, learners, parents, and community stakeholders;
- ii. Review, refine, and strictly align localized school security policies with the provisions of this Order;
- iii. Guarantee that immediate, transparent reporting mechanisms for any safety breaches or violent threats are fully operational; and
- iv. Conduct targeted awareness and vigilance sessions to cultivate a community-wide shield against violence.

6. The Office of the Schools Division Superintendent (OSDS), through the Schools Governance and Operations Division (SGOD), shall conduct unannounced school visitations to evaluate strict compliance with the prescribed security measures.

7. Immediate dissemination and compliance with this Memorandum is directed.

**GUIDELINES ON ENSURING A SAFE AND MOTIVATING
LEARNING ENVIRONMENT**

1. The Department of Education (DepEd) is mandated to protect and promote the right of every Filipino to quality, equitable, culture-based, and complete basic education, which includes creating an enabling and supporting learning environment where learners are protected and secured from any form of harm, abuse, and violence within and under its jurisdiction. Consistent with the DepEd's principle of promoting the welfare, safety, and security of learners, the **Guidelines on Ensuring a Safe and Motivating Learning Environment** is hereby adopted. This Order harmonizes all DepEd issuances with the common goal of ensuring a safe learning environment.
2. This Order consolidates various guidelines from all DepEd issuances that aimed to protect learners from any incident related to learner rights protection (LRP) concerns. These concerns include incidents such as bullying and gender-based violence, among others. This Order provides simplified, more coherent guidelines from prevention to response measures that covers common security protocols, consistent procedures for incident reporting, and the provision of mental health and psychosocial support for victims.
3. This Order expressly repeals the following:
 - a. DepEd Order (DO) No. 6, s. 1954 - Prohibiting the Practice of Hazing in Schools and Imposes Sanctions for Violations;
 - b. DO 70, s. 1999 - Prohibiting Students of Elementary and Secondary Schools from Using Cellular Phones and Pagers During Class Hours;
 - c. DO 26, s. 2000 - Prohibiting Students of Elementary and Secondary Schools from Using Cellular Phones and Pagers During Class Hours;
 - d. DO 83, s. 2003 - Reiteration to DECS Orders Nos. 70, s. 1999 and 26, s. 2000 (Prohibiting Students of Elementary and Secondary Schools from Using Cellular Phones and Pagers During Class Hours; and



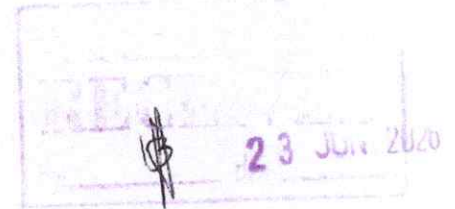
